

PORTLAND DISCRIMINATES AGAINST SUPERIOR OREGON UNIONS TWO HIGH PRICES BY

EGGS AT GOOD PRICE CARS INSTEAD OF APPLES SOLD

While storage eggs continue to show an active demand, some of the wholesale trade is very much inclined to show "cold feet" regarding the future of this output.

Sales of storage eggs are shown from 32c to 35c a dozen, the latter being for the selected white stock. One big creamery is trying to contract storage eggs for delivery until January 1 at the prices named. It appears to have little faith that the market will go to a higher point.

Fresh eggs continue to indicate a demand fully up to current supplies. Prices for buying and selling are unchanged.

Trade here does not appear to be affected in the slightest degree because of the previous weakness and slump in Eastern values. There is a demand at home for practically all the fresh offerings, which really net shippers as much, if not more, than shipping to the Eastern seaboard.

Heavier supplies of Salway peaches from Southern Oregon and the Delta are arriving. One Willamette valley peach shipper who changes the name of the variety on every shipment had a bunch of white peaches in the fruit. Most of the peaches from all sections were too green.
