

# RIVER PROJECTS. AUTHORIZED TO WAIT FOR MONEY

Washington, Oct. 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.) Lieutenant Colonel Pillsbury, in charge of the river and harbor division of the chief of engineers in the absence of General Harry C. Taylor, was asked to clear up confusion which has arisen as to when appropriations may be available and work begun on new projects authorized by the river and harbor bill recently signed by the president.

Among these are the Columbia river channel improvement, the jetties at Coos Bay, the Umpqua harbor improvement, dike removal from Willamette slough and Clatskanie river. It had been indicated by some of the news reports that work on new projects might be taken up at once.

**CANNOT BE DONE**  
"That cannot be done," said Colonel Pillsbury. "In the last act appropriating \$42,500,000 for rivers and harbors it was distinctly stated that this money was for 'preparation of projects heretofore authorized.' This was not language carelessly inserted, but was a deliberate direction by congress.

"There will be no money available to spend on projects recently authorized, therefore, until congress makes appropriations for them, and old balances cannot be used for that purpose. There are in the recent bill, however, a few modifications of existing projects, to which this does not apply."

**EXPECTS SLIGHT DELAY**  
Lieutenant Colonel Pillsbury added that little actual delay will occur, as congress will soon be in session again and is expected to pass a bill carrying appropriations for the new projects, enabling work to be started next spring or early summer, which, in most cases, is about as early as it could be begun in any event.

The engineers are preparing estimates for the next year's work, which includes all authorized projects, including those carried in the new bill. These estimates go to the director of the budget and will be submitted to congress at the beginning of the next session.

Lieutenant Colonel Pillsbury referred to the Columbia river plan as virtually an intensive program of the work already under way, and that the providing of a new dredge, and money will be asked for this work in the next appropriation bill.

This statement confirms the impression of local government engineers as quoted in The Journal that while many new projects have been authorized no money would be available until specific appropriation had been made by congress. Actually, getting the money is counted only less difficult than securing authorization.

**Postal Employees Are Now Offered Free Health Examination**  
Washington, Oct. 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.) Employees of the Portland and Astoria postoffices are among those who, in 57 cities, are offered the opportunity of free medical examination by government physicians. Portland and Seattle are among the cities where from one to six employees may be examined each day by medical officers of the public health service. Astoria and Tacoma are among those where the facilities will enable 15 examinations a month to be made.

The method followed is to make a complete examination upon application by the employee, who is informed what physical deficiency, if any, is found, and whether a doctor, dentist, oculist or other specialist should be consulted.
