(Special Cable to The Journal and the Chicago Daily News)

Peking, Oct. 18.—The Japanese legation denies emphatically that the Japanese in China have handed over any arms to General Chang Tso-Lin. The arms, it is claimed, were taken over to them from falling into the hands of Chinese factions and were retained in the original railway cars. It was discovered, however, that empty cars had been substituted for those loaded with arms and the Japanese are holding a court martial with the object of discovering and punishing the guilty partles.

General Chang Tso-Lin has declared that he did not obtain any arms through his Japanese advisers or from other Japanese sources.


