

SPEAKERS HOPE TO DRAW 150,000 TO LIVESTOCK SHOW

Today a flying squadron of 20 speakers from the Portland Chamber of Commerce, responding to the call of Chairman E. E. Fayville and Secretary E. H. Weinbaum of the chamber's agricultural committee, started out on a three-day intensive campaign of publicity with the objective of rolling up a 150,000 attendance at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition which will open on Saturday morning. Speeches will be made in all the schools and in civic clubs, fraternal meetings and at other gatherings. Saturday will be school children's day, with free admission to all boys and girls of school age. Forty-five thousand free tickets have been distributed to the children, and \$50 in cash has been offered by the chamber of commerce for the city school showing the highest attendance in proportion to its enrollment. Henri Thiele, official stockshow chef, is making preparations to supply lunches for 5000 children at 25 cents each; the lunch to consist of a bottle of milk, two sandwiches, three cakes, and a couple of apples. Siegfried Pieterje, Prospect, world's greatest milk cow, whose last year's yield totaled nearly 19 tons, will arrive at the stockshow pavilion tomorrow from the Carnation Stock Farm, Seattle. "Prospect's" production topped all records of all breeds last year. She will be installed in a special booth, elaborately decorated, and will be on view throughout stockshow week in the dairy barns. Oregon's world record Jersey cow, Lad's Iota, owned by S. J. McKee of Independence, will also arrive tomorrow. She will be housed in a cottage-barn which will be an exact reproduction of the typical building used in the Isle of Jersey, where cows are regarded as members of the family. She will be at home to stockshow patrons from Saturday morning throughout stockshow week.

War Risk Counsel In Portland to Aid Insurance Defense

The local suit was brought by Mrs. Ella and Miss Esther Farley, mother and sister of the late Kenneth Farley, against the widow of Kenneth Farley, in an effort to prove that the widow is not the lawful beneficiary. The government has taken the position that the widow is the legal beneficiary and will defend her.

Surplus Fund of \$5000 Is Shown for Riverview Cemetery

Surplus current funds totaling more than \$5000, in addition to a perpetual maintenance fund in excess of \$4000,

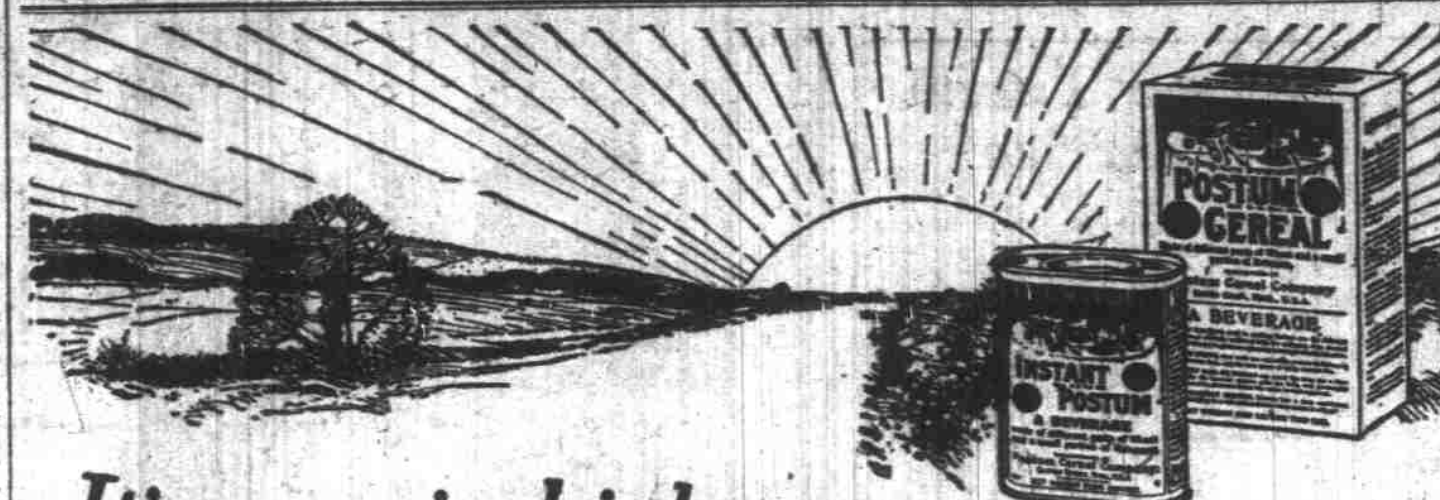
were shown by the financial report of the Riverview Cemetery association for October. According to the report of the trustees, current funds deposited in the First National bank October 31 consisted of \$4000 in government bonds and \$1112.32 in cash. Total cash increase in the maintenance fund since January 1 was \$4757.71, of which \$441.33 was added in October. The maintenance fund has been invested by the United States National bank in government bonds. Receipts from the sale of lots in October amounted to \$2155.30, which is the largest amount

received from that source during the year. Besides meeting current obligations the trustees paid off \$1000 borrowed in 1921 by the previous management of the cemetery.

Oregon Woods to Be Used by Plant

A manufacturing plant to utilize Oregon wood products will be created immediately at the southeast corner of Larrabee and Delany streets by the Seader Manufacturing company, according to announcement made today. The site is convenient to rail and water transportation and the plant will employ

about 20 operatives. The Seader company was incorporated Wednesday with a capitalization of \$25,000. Organizers of the concern are E. J. English of Harlowton, Mont.; J. P. English and S. A. Marquette of Portland.
