

25 Pastors Asked to Aid Foreign-Born Survey Program

WOMAN TO CALL OF CHILDREN'S MARCH TOWARD BIBLE LAND

The Portland Americanization council has issued a letter to 250 Portland pastors asking them for specific assistance by furnishing the names of the president of the "Woman's Society" from whom it is planned to secure volunteer workers in the city-wide survey of the foreign-born population which the council proposes to make.

The council recently issued a folder setting forth definite things that various groups of people can do to assist in reaching the non-English speaking people of the city.

Under the heading, "What the Churches Can Do," the pamphlet says:

"Get into contact immediately with immigrants of your own kind and render such services as may be needed.

"Make your church a center for Americanization activities. Are you not partly responsible if your communicants do not speak English, and are not citizens and do not meet the American test?"

As long as you have an interest in the foreign-born, you are forced to organize and maintain churches and social organizations of their own.

Include in the study classes and programs the need and work of Americanization. Formulate plans and cooperate with the Portland Americanization committee to furnish volunteer workers for the various work-classes and work-teachers, visit, investigators, etc.

See that the entire church membership is being supplied with Americanization literature. Write to the headquarters of your religious denomination for literature.

Cooperate with the Portland Americanization council, not according to your religious beliefs, but according to the dictates of your conscience as an American.

Four Days Remain For Completion of Willamette Drive

Only four days remain in which Willamette university's forward movement campaign for an endowment of \$1,250,000 may be pushed to victory and the ministers and laymen of the Methodist church in Oregon are determined to make the most of the time. The entire state is at work, so far as the Methodist church is concerned. Bishop Shepard, the district superintendent, ministers and laymen are working in all parts of the state. Portland and Salem are engaged in a race to see which may receive the largest amount of money.
