

# BELLBOY SAYS HE DROVE CAR THAT INJURED WOMAN

Ben Rutherford sought refuge at police headquarters today from what he feared might be an effort to lynch him. Rutherford, who is a bellboy at the Portland Hotel, admitted that it was his automobile that had struck Miss Anna Filip at Inslay avenue and Milwaukee street Wednesday afternoon, causing serious injuries to the woman and wrecking the car against a post. Rutherford and his companion, both colored, fled when the crowd gathered leaving the injured woman and wrecked machine.

Police locked up Rutherford on a charge of failing to report an accident and with reckless driving.

Miss Filip, aged 22, a domestic, is in St. Vincent's hospital in a serious condition. She suffered injuries to her face and right side.

Miss Filip, who lives at No. 683 Inslay avenue, had just crossed Milwaukee street, when the touring car struck her. The driver then lost control of the machine and crashed into a telephone pole, reducing the expensive car to a heap of tangled steel and wood.

## TWO IN FRONT SEAT

In the front seat with the driver was another of his own race. The pair jumped from the car when it stopped and stood for a moment reflecting on what they had done, but instead of offering any assistance to their injured victim, ran away. One of them sneaked off through a crowd of spectators, which quickly gathered and was stopped by a street car conductor. He wrestled free from his captor and then sped down the street. His companion also escaped.

## HAD STRUCK OTHER CAR

After the excitement of the accident at Inslay avenue, it was learned that the same car had struck another car, registered to Charles Wolf, Milwaukee, at Harold avenue, one block south of where Miss Filip was injured. The car did not stop there, either.

Patrolman Russell of the east side station investigated the car and discovered that a pint bottle, partly filled with liquor, had been found in the car by a pedestrian. This was sent to the police station.

Russell also interviewed J. W. Ferguson, Spalding building, and C. J. Nochtigal, No. 125 East 11th street, who were first on the scene. Both said the driver was under the influence of liquor.

M. Moyer, No. 504 East Ash street, a driver for the Troy laundry, reported to the police that a touring car, which he said was the same one which was wrecked, passed him at Jennings Lodge on the Oregon City road, a few minutes before the crash. He estimated the speed of the machine at about 50 miles per hour.

Miss Filip was employed in the home of C. C. Murton, No. 898 Overton street.

## Mrs. L. V. Jenkins Removed to Home

Mrs. L. V. Jenkins, wife of the chief of police, who was injured in an automobile accident Tuesday night, was removed from St. Vincent's hospital to her home at No. 541 Marguerite avenue, Wednesday afternoon. Mrs. Jenkins' left wrist was fractured and she was badly bruised. Mrs. Bert Hall, who was in the car with Mrs. Jenkins, was reported to be recovering from scalp wounds which she received.

Mrs. William Fordyce of Itsum, Wash., died Tuesday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Garrett N. Versteeg of Irvington. Mrs. Fordyce was one of the pioneers of the community in which she lived where she enjoyed the friendship of an unusually wide circle of friends. Funeral services were held today at the Congregational church at White Salmon, Wash., where interment took place.

The highwayman was armed with a black-jack, which he wielded over Holmes' head. Because of the fog Holmes did not see the man until he was almost upon him. The bandit was described as being about 35 years old, 5 feet tall and weighing 165 pounds. He wore a heavy black coat and a dark cap.
