

Asks That Part of Gloor Estate Be Set Aside for Children

No effort will be made to prevent Mrs. Ursula Gloor from tearing down and removing a house from No. 151 Grover street to a new site on the east side, in compliance with what she believes to be the decree of Providence, but a part of the personal property left in trust by her husband will be set aside to safeguard the interests of her children, A. L. Vesic, attorney for the estate, announced today.

The house is half wrecked now. Vesic said she would be within her right in asking for a homestead claim on the house. The house is valued at \$5000 and the personal property of the estate at \$5000. Vesic said he was preparing to present a petition to Circuit Judge Taxwell of the probate court asking for a part of the personal property to be set aside. Mrs. Gloor is executrix of the estate and has control over all of the property. According to Vesic, she has expressed a willingness to compromise the matter.

She informed officers of the probate court she was acting under divine guidance in demolishing her home and removing it to a new site. These actions by fellow members of a zealous religious faith who expected the property to be much enhanced in value by the new bridge across the river, which may require this for the approach.
