SPORANE, Wash., June 27.—Asa T. Wicks, of this city, who for years has de-voted his spare time to devising some perpetual motion machine, has as a re-sult of his study of perpetual motion, been able to devise a duplicating and reciprocating wheel. The purpose of the wheel is to double the amount of work and speed obtained in the use of the ordinary crank or executive appliance in DETROIT, June 29.-Twenty-eight producing rectilinear motions. Letters patent have been taken out. J. T. Hamilton has purchased a half interest in the patent and practical tests of the wheel are now being made by Bushnell, Warden & Glesseigler, and by the Legar Scott Threshing Machine company. The wheel was designed with a view to devising an apparatus for increasing the speed of sickle knives in mowers.

PREPARING FOR WAR.

Austria to Construct Fortifications at Places Open to Sudden Attack.

VILNNA, June 27 .- This year will witness a great addition to the military expenses of Austria. This increase is made necessary by the formidable atti-inde of Russia, near the Austrian fronticr, and the probability that the Russian forces in that direction will be increased instead of diminished. Austria proposes practically to put Russia in a state of military occupation, with a force sufficient to confront an unexpected attack. Permanent barracks are to be crected in Cracow, rezeszow, Tarnopol and Prze-myall and other places, to take the place of temporary barracks, put up during the war scare of about three years ago. The temporary barracks were of timber the new barracks will be of stone and will cost many millions of florins. New fort ifications are also to be constructed for the defense of places now open to sudden attacks; the artillery in Galicia is to be raised to a war footing, new light repeatraised to a war looting, new light repeat-ing rifles are to be served out to the troops, and smokeless powder provided for the heavy ordinance. Altogether, when these costly preparations are com-pleated, Russia will find herself face to face with a well organized force, in strength and equipment at least equal to her own.
