SALT LAKE, Utah, Sept. 18 .- The irrigation congress closed its session today, after promulgating the following resolutions as a result of the deliberations of the convention:

Resolved, That this congress is in favor of granting in trust, upon such condition as shall best serve the public interest, to the states and territories needful of irrigation, all lands now a part of the public domain with such states and territories, except mineral land, for the purpose of developing irrigation to render pose of developing irrigation to render the lands now arid, fertile and capable

DENIED TO PALESTINE.

Russian Jews Not Allowed to Land at Jaffa

LONDON, Sept. 18 .- The pathetic spectacle of denying the Jews admission even to Palestine was witnessed last week at the port of Jaffa. The exiled Hebrews had to go back without being permitted to set foot on shore. The Jews then applied at various ports, but were rejected at all of them. They were then conveyed to Crorus. 'In the city of Jerusalem the Turkish authorities are enforcing regulations calculated to annoy the Jewish residents and induce them to leave. Nevertheless an English tourist writing from Palestine says the soil of the country is ample for the sup-port of a large population, and that virtually no attempt is now made to work it. The same writer thinks that the sultan would readily grant the Jews access to the Holy Land, provided he received a large sum of money for the privilege, and that he will not until then relax the existing situation.

It seems to have been a deliberate case of suicide, as her hands were free and rested on the ground. The family had some trouble about a piece of property which had been attached for debt, and she had been drinking slightly in the last day or two. He was led from the jail to the iron bridge, where they asked him if he had anything to say, to which he replied, "I would like a glass of water and a priest." He then gave the names and told where his relatives resided, and requested that they be written to, but that they should not be informed of the manner of his death. He was informed that a priest was not present, and that his request in that particular could not be complied with. He was given a drink of water, also a flask of whisky, which he drank eagerly.
