Raking Over Old Straw ROCHESTER, Feb. 17 .- At the annual banquet last night of the chamber of commerce, Major-General Nelson Miles spoke on coast defenses. He said that while in 1865 we had a well-fortified coast, and the most formidable navy affoat, consisting of 613 vessels, carrying several thousand guns, now our coast was entirely defenseless even against a small fleet of hostile vessels. The power of fortifications properly equipped to resist any land or navy force had been demonstrated at Gibraltar, Sabastapol, Fort Sumpter and many other places, loading rifled cannon and mortars, with torpedoes and submarine mines, were the only safe-guards upon which we could rely for protection at twenty-seven principal ports. There was no prospect of our navy attaining more than fourth

The U. K. Catch a Blizzard. LONDON, Feb. 17. -Cold weather, gales and snow storms, which set in last night throughout the United Kingdom, continue today. There has been a heavy fall of snow in London. Traffic of all kinds is greatly impeded, and telegraphic communication interfered with, In the English channel a gale is blowing with great violence, and service between England and the Continent is greatly delayed. The air is so thick with snow it

Throckmorton and Morrow's Cases.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16 .- Though the verdict of the court-martial in the case of Maj. Charles B. Throckmorton, tried on charges of duplicating his pay accounts, will not be officially announced until the president has formally acted upon the papers, it has become pretty generally known throughout the war department that the sentence is dismissal. It is generally expected the president will mitigate the sentence to two or three years' suspension on half or threequarters pay.
