The Australian system of registering titles to land, when it becomes better known, is likely to become as popular as the Australian system of voting. It is popularly known as the Torrens system, from its author Sir Robert Torrens who introduced it into South Australia in 1858. The system gives the purchaser of real estate absolute protection while the transfer is as simple and inexpensive as the transfer of shares of bank or railway stock. The state guarantees The Australian system of registering railway stock. The state guarantees the title of every piece of real estate accepted for registration, first determining cepted for registration, first determining the ownership and thereafter permitting it to pass from hand to hand with all the facility attending the transfer of a horse or a carriage.
