TAMMANNY NOT FOR HARRISON

The East Oregonian says: Every oppressor of the people and every man who secretly desires to destroy liberty and equality in this country, are for Harrison.

The East Oregonion forgets. manny is not for Harrison. What is Tammanny? It is a political society which rules New York city, which rules the state of New York, which largely rules the nation. It is a society whose minions, according to the statement of Henry M. It is presumed the agency will make no charge for its services, the expenses of the office, if any, being raised by the voluntary contributions of those in favor of the scheme. Will the scheme work? That is the question. The trouble is, there is always a class of white laborers who would wather starve or beg or loaf than saw cord wood or do other chores that give employment to so many chinamen.
