Wool is less than half the price it was 20 years ago. In 1872 the price of colonial wools in London was \$133 per bale. The same wool today sells for \$66. The decline has been steady and nearly uniform.

Foreign wool has declined 30 per cent. within a year. At recent London colonial wool sales prices declined 5 per cent. below the previous auctions which were the lowest ever reached in Europe.
