A New Lifeboat.

A new kind of lifeboat has been constructed to the order of the Boulogne Humane society on a model designed by one of its members. The construction of the new boat is simple and economical, and could be adapted to any sea-going rowing boat.

These compartments are protected from injury by a casing forming double bulwarks, inasmuch as the shape of the hull preserves perfectly its boatlike appearances. It means really a little more beam and consequently more stability.

The outward application of these air cases gives greater solidity to the boat's side in the event of being staved in, and will tend to prevent accidents such as happen through people bringing their weight to bear on one side of a boat when pulling a person out of the water.
