Thomb Rings.

Men's thumb rings are no rarities to collectors. Some of the Roman specimens must have been cumbrous wear. one in the Montfaucon collection, bearing the bust of Trajan's consort, Plotina. measuring over three inches across. Mediaval churchmen of high degree did not allow "the largest, first and shortest of the fingers" to go unadorned. A massive gold ring was found upon the thumb of the supposed skeleton of Hilary, hishop of Chichester, who died in 1169; and the recumbent effigy of Bishop Oldham, in Exeter cathedral, is remarkable for the pressed together thumbs being inclosed

by a single ring.

When the shrine of St. Thomas a Becket was robbed of its treasures, the famous archbishop's thumb ring, given to him by the king of France, graced with a ruby the size of a hen's egg, found its way to the thamb of bluff King Hal; and as the humor of the king is always voted just the thing, we may be sure the royal hand was not the only one so decked at court. Mayors and aldermen imitated their betters. When I was about thy years. Hal, says the fat knight, "I was not an eagles talon in the waist; I could have crept into an al-derman's thumb ring."—Chambers Jour-

Duration of Life Among Birds The distinguished German biologist, Weisman, has pointed out that there is less exact knowledge on the subject of duration of life among birds than might be expected, considering how many in number are the ornithologists and the ornithological societies. Small singing birds live from eight to eighteen years Ravens have lived for almost 100 years in captivity, and parrots longer than that. Fowls live ten to twenty years (and are then sold as spring chickens to

young housekeepers). The wild goose lives upward of 100 years, and swans are said to have at-tained the age of 300. The long life of pirds has been interpreted as compensa tion for their feeble fertility, and for the

great mortality of their young. Obviously, as Weisman observes, such birds must reach a great age, or they would long ago have been exterminated
