This is the season of the year when the great army of gardeners employed by New York's millionaires who have a fad for flowers are putting their hotheuses in shape for the winter. I met Jay Gould's chief gardener yesterday and he told me that everything was in excellent shape at the railroad king's \$500,000 hotheouse up the Hudson. A lot of choice plants and exotics have just arrived from India and other eastern countries.

John Hoey's difficulties have not deterred him from looking after his pet flowers in his grand hotheouses at Hollywood, N. J. I am told his chief gardener has had several conferences with Mr. Hoey during the past two weeks about his favorite flowers and their care. Mr. Hoey is passionately fond of flowers, and selects the seeds and bulbs himself, and at times superintends the work of his gardeners.

Another man who has a half a million dollar hotheouse is the Standard Oil King, John D. Rockefeller, who has a palace on the Hudson. He has not been in the city long and his gardeners are constantly receiving new additions. Mr. Rockefeller says he will have the finest flower show in the world in a year or two. -New York Telegram.
