Crime Decreasing.

All the criminal returns published of late have happily tended to show that crime is decreasing. The judicial statistics for the past year bear the same testimony. Whether under the head of "criminal classes at large" or "in local and convict prisons and reformatories," the figures show a steady decline. The same is true of the houses of bad character, by which is meant such as are the resort of thieves, depredaters and suspected persons. In England and Wales there are 2,688 houses of this description.

It seems rather odd to be told that of these 845 are public houses and 285 beer shops, because if they are known resorts of such characters, why are their licenses not withdrawn? Is it for the reason once given by a French administrator that they serve the ends of the law by providing places where those who are wanted by the police can easily be found? The known houses of receivers of stolen goods had declined from 778 two years ago to 734 last year.—London Telegraph.
