NEEDS A PETITION.

By the provisions of the 3d section of the act of congress approved September 29th, 1890, settlers on forfeited railroad lands were allowed two years from the date of that act in which to make payments for their lands.

In July last congress passed an additional act giving a further extension until September 29th, 1893, but confined its action to actual bona fide residents on the land.

But the delegation must have something with which to go before the committee. If parties interested would get up petitions in the different neighborhoods, stating their need of a further extension and giving the reasons why it is needed, and send such petition, before the meeting of congress, to Senator Dolph, who is chairman of the committee on public lands in the United States senate, it is confidently hoped that a further extension of two years from February 3d, 1893 can be obtained.

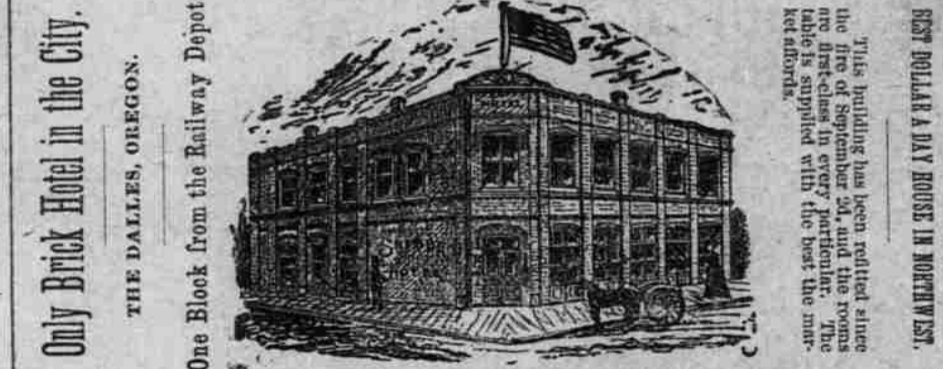
