Owing to delays in the issue of special instructions necessary to put the act in force, congress framed on February 18th, 1891, an amendment to the original act, making the time for payments date from February 3d, 1891, thus giving claimants until February 3d, 1803 in which to pay.

In July last congress passed an additional act giving a further, extension until September 29th, 1893, but confined its action to actual bona fide residents on the land. The attention of Senator Mitchell was called to this subject when irom and after this date.
