Prof. T. L. Washburne, of the experiment station of the state agricultural college at Corvallis states that, during the season just passed, they have saved at least 85 per cent. of the apples with three or four sprayings. Twenty cents per tree for old and full grown trees will cover the expense of spraying for the season. By this it is seen that the expense of spraying is really nothing. In this town today a bushel of apples free from the codlin moth will sell for twenty cents more a bushel than in which the codlin has done his work. The difference on one bushel of apples will pay the expense of spraying the entire tree through the season. Our fruit growers must adopt this means of extermination of the pest or our market must be supplied from some other territory. Hundreds of apple trees can be found in this county on which the entire crop has been destroyed by the codlin moth. Another method of killing them is to tie a band around the tree, leaving loose flaps under which they will congregate, and occasionally remove the band and kill the pests gathered there. This is quite highly recommended and is a simple
