A War Time Belle.
 A relic of the war between the states
 is now on the dry dock, receiving such
 minor repairs and cleaning as may be
 necessary to commission her for harbor
 defense. This was the second monitor
 ever built, and the record of her useful-
 ness and her hard service may be seen
 in the shot dents of the turrets. These
 are painted in a color different from that
 of the surrounding iron in order to em-
 phasize their story, and they serve as an
 object lesson to show that after all,
 when compared with our days, how in-
 nocuous were the boasted shot and shell
 of the rebellion. Of course it does not
 make much difference whether a giant
 is killed by a toothpick or hoisted with
 a petard. He is dead all the same, and
 worms will eat him. But we were
 proud, and with good reason, of those
 big smooth bores and of their charges in
 those perilous days.
 Then the theory was that for every
 ten pounds of shot one pound of powder
 was needed, a 90-pounder being fired
 with nine pounds of powder; today we
 have for each pound of powder two
 pounds of shot, the 10-inch guns of the
 Miantonomoh, the Nantucket's neigh-
 bor, using 250 pounds of powder to drive
 the 500-pound projectile. The Nan-
 tucket has also a sentimental interest,
 for when the great Ericsson lay in state
 on her decks in the harbor of New York,
 she was the immediate representative of
 what his genius had evoked to save the
 country in time of peril, for the original
 Monitor went down one dismal day off
 our treacherous coast, and left as the
 second product of her wonderful type
 the little coast defender which now lies
 half hidden within the walls of the dry
 dock.—Harper's Weekly

Notice.
 By Order of the Common Council of Dalles
 City, made and entered on the 12th day of Octo-
 ber, 1892, notice is hereby given that said city
 council is about to proceed to order and make
 improvements in streets in said city, as hereinaf-
 ter stated, and the cost of such improvements
 will be levied upon the property adjacent thereto,
 and said improvement will be made, unless
 within fourteen days from the final publication
 of this notice, the owners of two-thirds of the
 property adjacent thereto, shall file their re-
 monstrance against such improvements as by
 charter provided.
 The improvement contemplated and about to
 be made is as follows, to-wit:
 To improve Washington, Fulton and Laughlin
 streets in said city, by constructing a sewer of
 terra-cotta, from the Columbia river at the foot
 of said Washington street, and running thence
 south on said Washington street, to the junction
 of said street with Fulton street, and running
 thence easterly a one and one-half inch terra-cotta
 pipe to the junction of said Fulton street, to the
 junction of said Fulton street with Laughlin
 street, and running thence southerly along said
 Laughlin street, to the alley next south of Alford
 street, said sewer to be of twelve inch terra-cotta
 pipe from the point of beginning, above men-
 tioned to the alley between Fifth and Sixth
 streets, and of ten inch terra-cotta pipe from said
 pipe, to the termination thereof, as above stated
 at the 12th day of October, 1892.
