But we were proud, and with good reason, of those big smooth bores and of their charges in

those parlous days. Then the theory was that for every ten pounds of shot one pound of powder was needed, a 90-pounder being fired with nine pounds of powder; today we have for each pound of powder two pounds of shot, the 10-inch guns of the Miantonomoh, the Nantucket's neighbor, using 250 pounds of powder to drive the 500-pound projectile. The Nan-tucket has also a sentimental interest, for when the great Ericsson lay in state on her decks in the harbor of New York, she was the immediate representative of what his genius had evoked to save the country in time of peril, for the original Monitor went down one dismal day off our treacherous coast, and left as the second product of her wonderful type the little coast defender which now lies half hidden within the walls of the dry dock.-Harper's Weekly
