A special from Washington says "President Harrison, is his message to congress, will not turn his back upon the present republican tariff law. On the contrary, he will give it an earnest indorsement."

If he shall take the wise view that the people know what they want, and are entitled to what they want, if he shall take up the work of tariff reform at the beginning of the coming session of congress, he will do a graceful act, an honorable act, an act of wisdom, that will render him great and his party strong. It is a situation worthy of his honesty of purpose and his cheerful obedience to the will of the people who have honored him with the highest office within their He can render the second administration of Grover Cleveland merely a continuance of the administration of Benjamin Harrison if he chooses to do so.


