How a Morocco Town Received its Name.

The place is Tetnan, which has about 20,000 inhabitants, and is noted for its manufacture of a large variety of Moroccan wares. Centuries ago the inhabitants were in deadly fear of the wild Berber tribes who inhabited the Rif mountains. They kept a watchman upon a lofty minaret, and whenever he saw indications of approaching danger he cried at the top of his voice, to arouse all the inhabitants, "Tet-Tagne! Tet-Tagne!" (Open your eyes! Open your eyes!) in course of time the settlement was renamed, and it derived its new appellation from this warning cry. —Goldthwaite's Geographical Magazine
