Three months ago the free mail delivery system was ins rated in the town. It has proven a failure. A great deal of foreign mail mat-ter is received at the postoffice daily, but no streets or numbers are given. The letter carriers simply take a bag of mail and march through the town blowing a

whistle. The people turn out and the carrier allows them to examine the letters. In this way he delivers to owners. people are honest enough, and will not take a letter that does not belong to them. The postoffice authorities at Washington, however, do not like the mode of delivery, and it is likely that the free delivery system will be discontinued.— Cor. St. Louis Globe-Democrat.
