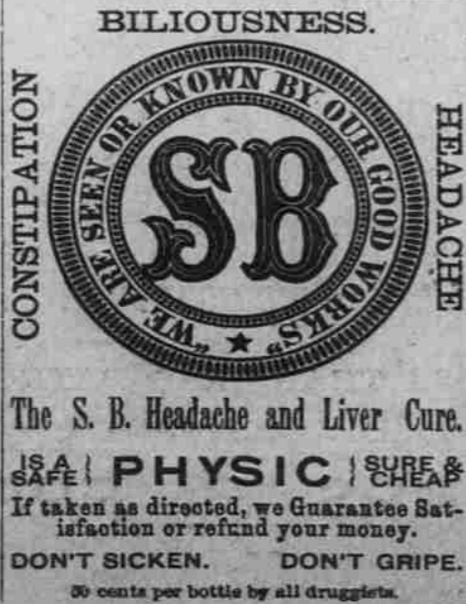

Giving Wood a Good Color.
 Many hard woods of superior color and grain may be greatly improved by treatment. The graining or marking of the wood is always a beautiful feature, and it can be greatly improved and accentuated, if faint, by giving the entire piece one coat of raw oil, and then with a camel's hair brush going over the various lines and veinings several times. Each coat increases the color. A slight coat of varnish will help to keep the color.—New York Tribune.
