A general complaint is made about the closeness of the financial condition of the country. The call on brokers for money to make payment on forfeited railroad lands, which is limited to the third of Febraary next has quite exhansted the aurplus in the hands of those who loan through sgents, this is is reason for less business among our dealers. Prices have not changed unless it be in sugars, which Portiand recently. Other staples continues to move on old prices. <br> Produce is in good supply, except eggs, which continue scarce and prices remain stendy.
