The new postal money orders which have been ordered by the government will soon be issued. In the new system there is little or no complication. Sheets will be issued calling for amounts from one cent to three dollars, which will be torn off to suit the purchasers. The postmaster will have no writing to do on it, the sender simply endorsing it the same as a check or draft. One cent will pay the charges on any amount up to three dollors, instead of five cents as at present.

Judson of Pierce county, Wash., has introduced a bill to make primaries respectable and decent, regulate them and punish frauds. 
