### Opening Letters by Law.

"I noticed a short time ago," said a Washington official, "that some objection was made by a Mr. Pell, of the San Domingo Shore Line road, to the opening of a private letter by the chief of the secret service bureau. It is not generally known that the rules of the postoffice department empower inspectors to open suspicious letters at discretion. The public appear to be very much astonished at this proceeding mentioned, but I assure you that it is carried to a greater extent

than even those who know all about it In fact, under the rules of the postoffice department almost any private letter can be opened and read. This will surprise some people, I presume, but it is nevertheless true, and a reference to the private instructions to postoffice in-spectors, which are in printed form, will convince anybody of it. Whether such secret privileges are ever used illegitimately would be difficult to find out. It is a good deal like arresting a man on suspicion. As a matter of fact, therefore, you will see the United States mails are no more sacred than the mails in Russia or any other country so far as govern-ment espionage is concerned."—New York Herald.

The Gulf Stream

The question is often asked, To what extent does the Gulf Stream modify the climate of the United States? To its supposed erratic movements is laid the blame of every abnormal season. There is every evidence that the Gulf Stream is governed absolutely by law in all its changes. The course through the ocean is without doubt fixed. Its fluctuations are by days, by months, by seasons or by years, and they do not vary materially one from the other. Its temperature changes, depending upon the relative heat of the tropical and polar seasons, and upon the strength of the producing trade winds. The warm water may be driven toward the shore by the waves caused by a favorable wind, but the current remains in its proper place. The warm water gives off a certain amount of heat to the air above it, and if this air is moved to the land we feel the heat.

The presence of the warm water on the coast of Europe would in no way modify the climate if the prevailing winds were easterly instead of westerly. CHRONICLE If the prevailing winds in New England in winter were southeast instead of northwest, the climate would be equal to that of the Azore islands, mild and baliny. For the cause of abnormal seasons we may look to meteorology. The current is in its place ready to give off the heat and moisture to the air whenever the demand is made upon it, but by the erratic movements of the air this heat and moisture may be delivered at unexpected times and seasons, and thus give rise to the erroneous belief that the Gulf Stream itself has gone astray .-John E. Pillsbury in Century.

The Postage Stamp Nearly 52 Years Old. The postage stamp will be fifty-two years old in May. Its inventor was a printer, James Chalmers, of Dundee, Scotland, who died in 1853. England, fifty-two years ago, introduced the new system of prepaying letter postage, and according to a decree of Dec. 21, 1800, issued the first stamps, which were to be put before the public on May 6 of the following year. A year later they were introduced in the United States and Switzerland, and within three years had become common in Bavaria, Belgium and France.-Charleston News and Courier.
