It would be quite as reasonable to condemn the whole city of Portland, as a city, because, forsooth, some fellow residing there made a fool or an ass of himself. The people of Salem generally do not oppose the location of the Soldiers' Home at Roseburg since it is provided for at all. And they are not opposed to the location of the branch asylum in Eastern Oregon. .They understand that it would not take long for the people to change by vote the constitutional provision for the locations of all the state institution here. 
