The Boston Herald estimates that the National banks hold about \$170,000,000 of gold in their vaults. Practically every dollar of this would be handed over to the secretary of the treasury in exchange for United States bonds. Many persons will wonder why the bankers do not use some of this gold to meet the foreign demand, instead of calling upon the treasury department to find the yellow metal for them. There seems to be something radically wrong in our financial system. When the banks of England, France or Germany are losing gold too fast they put up the rate of discount. On one or two occasions the bank of England has refused specie payments, and yet trade in England was not paralyzed. Do we not make a fetich of gold in our financial system?

The proposition to establish government warehouses or sub-treasuries where agricultural products might be deposited money borrowed thereon was denounced generally as preposterous, says the Louisville Courier Journal. The discussion of the idea did not strengthen it; on the contrary, it has ceased to be a living issue, and has been almost forgotten. What the government refused to do for the farmer it has done and is doing for the silver miner. Indeed, it is doing more for the miner than any representative of the farmer ever dared ask. Instead of receiving the silver on deposit at the owners' risk, the government actually purchases all the product of the American miner with the avowed purpose of keeping up the market price.

Since dollars are coined out of sixty cents' worth of silver, says the Scientific American, it is no wonder that counter feiters have turned honest and are getting out dollars containing the same amount of silver as the genuine, and undistinguishable from the mint issue. In former times, when a silver dollar was worth 100 cents, counterfeiters had to use baser metals, which soon led to their detection. But when the government itself gives a fictitious value to its coinage, who is there to deprecate the acts of individuals who issue a dollar of the same value as the government?


