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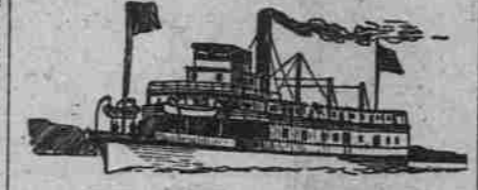

NEWS FROM HAWAII

Raising of the National Flag Over the Palace June 2d.

FINAL BLOW TO THE MONARCHY

The Indebtedness of the Government to Claus Spreckels has been Liquidated.

HONOLULU, June 10.—For the first time in the history of the Hawaiian Islands the Hawaiian national flag was floated over the palace June 2d.

Minister Blount is anxious to return home, and both the royalists and annexationists would be glad to have the question settled one way or the other.

The provisional government has passed a law giving the attorney-general discretionary powers in admitting to bail persons charged with murder, treason or seditious offenses.

The provisional government played its trump card June 9th by publishing the text of the power of attorney given by Liliuokalani to Paul R. Neumann when he went to the United States to work against annexation.
