The Oregonian has done some excellent service in the way of educating the masses on the silver question and to it we are indebted for a very simple illustration of the results that would follow the adoption of free and unlimited coinage. It is notorious, says the journal, that one ounce of gold will buy twenty-four ounces of silver in any market in the world. But the ratio of our coinage is sixteen ounces of silver to one ounce of gold. Can anyone possibly fail to see, therefore, that, if free coinage of silver were allowed, he who has an ounce of gold could and would exchange it for twenty-four ounces of silver, get sixteen ounces of the silver coined, pass it into circulation at parity with gold and have eight ounces of silver left for his profit in the transaction? The money-broker would do this as certainly as he were allowed the opportunity, and the process would continue till no gold could be had; and, with disappearance of gold the silver coin, dropping to the value of silver bullion, would become the basis of prices.
