Declared a Traitor.

WASHINGTON, July S .- A dispatch from San Francisco today, stating that a young Gautemalan named Santillana had been declared a traitor to Gautemala by Dictator Barrios, in consequence of his having patented in the United States in his own name a valuable device for measuring distances between inaccessible places, instead of in the name of the dictator, was shown to the patent officials. A search of the records discloses the fact that June 20 last a patent was granted Juan F. Santillana, a citizen of Salvador, residing in San Francisco, for a measuring and leveling telemeter, a one-fourth interest in which he assigns to Estorjio Calderon, of the same place. Nothing is known at the patent office as to the value of the invention, or as to whether fraud was practiced upon Dictator Barrios in the procurement of the patent.

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Torture and Robbery.

Springfield, Ill., July 8 .- A special from Pittsfield, Pike county, gives the particulars of a dastardly outrage committed in the vicinity of Pleasant Hill. Two aged Frenchmen named Joseph and Frank Reignor were supposed to have considerable money about their house. Two white men and one negro, thought to have driven from Clarkesville, Mo., Thursday evening, drove to the house, and drawing revolvers bound and gagged Frank Reignor and told his brother to hand over the money. He gave them a pocketbook, but, not satisfied, they hung him up by the neck. As he still continued obdurate, they applied flames to his back and shoulders. After three hours of torture, he finally revealed the uable papers. Great excitement prevails and the sheriff and posse are hunting for the desperadoes.

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


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
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
