Alexandria sailed from San Francisco last April, under the Hawaiian flag, on
a hunting and fishing voyage in the North Pacific ocean. She was com-
manded by one of the McLean brothers, who became notorious last year on ac-
count of having raided the seal rookeries of the Japan coast. When the steamer
sailed from San Francisco she carried an unusually large crew and was well armed
with rifles and small cannon with riftes and small cannon. It is gen
