**Twelve Men Drowned.**

VIENNA, July 18.—The iron gates in the River Danube, where many lives have been lost, claimed twelve more victims today. For some time past operations have been carried on with the object of taking out of the river rocks that have given the name of Iron Gates to this part of the river. Twelve workmen, who were in a small boat, were caught in the current, which runs with great violence at this point, and dashed against a dredger moored in the stream. The boat was smashed and the men thrown into the river. They were carried down the stream by the rushing waters before any assistance could be given them and every man of the party drowned.
