you now. She explained that the object of the forty days of fasting was to cleanse the blood of its impurities. "It is a fact demonstrated by science," she said, "that the blood is filled with minute animals or microbes, which can be seen with the aid of a microscope. These animals were placed in the blood as a penalty for the sin of Adam, and it is only when the blood is purged of them of Adam before he had sinned. This minute animal life cannot subsist on the food partaken by myself and my people during our fast, and the blood polluted by them is supplanted by the

blood of God. "It is only when my people are called upon by God to do so that they undertake to fast, and then he sustains life for them. They cannot die so long as they obey his commands. They live on the body and blood of Jesus Christ. At the end of their fasting they have no desire to sin. Their passions are dead. Married people do not live together as man and wife, and unmarried people have no desire to marry. They are contented. They are happy."

FRANCES ULTIMATUM.

Siam Must Comply With the Same Within Twenty-Four Hours.

London, July 19 .- Advices confirm Figure says the terms of the ultimatum are that Siam evamate the left bank of the Me-Kong river, give guarantees for the faithful performance of treaty obligations, and pay indemnity for outrages on the French. As France is already in possession of the Lower Me-Kong, she will control nearly the entire river if Siam concedes. This is a decided extension of the French claims toward the west, as the mountain range, heretofore the boundary of the French claims, lies far east of Me Kong river. The present claims take in the western bank of the river, giving France both banks and the entire control of it for most of its length, practically coming to the border of British territory.

Besides making the Me Kong the limit of the French possessions, France claims all the islands on the Me Kong.

Washington, July 18 .- Comptroller Eckels sent a dispatch to the national bank examiner at Denver today in which he says: "I wish you would announce to the officers of the banks which have failed in Denver that it is my intention to lend them every aid possible looking toward a speedy resumption on their part, and that I shall not only grant them sufficient time to enable them to collect such amounts as are speedily collectable, but to get together such amounts as will enable them to open on a small basis."
