Making Cloth Waterproof.
A correspondent asks for a recipe for making cloth waterproof. There is surely no better method than putting half a pound of sugar of lead and half a pound of alum in a pail of soft water, stirring it often until it becomes clear, pouring it off into another pail and putting the cloth or garment into it, to remain there for twenty-four hours. The material should then be hung up to dry without wringing. It is said that garments thus treated will keep the wearer absolutely dry in the heaviest rain-storm; the rain simply hangs in globules upon the cloth. Waterproof cloth is more healthy to wear than rubber goods.
