RAILWAY RUMBLINGS.

A PNEUMATIC bumper to be used on trolley cars, to knock careless pedestrians out of the way without hurting them, has been contrived by a Baltimorean.

Four railway companies, the Great Western, the Great Eastern, the South-western and the North-western bring into London about 20,000,000 gallons of milk every year.

Five hours is the running time between Boston and New York on the Shore Line of the New York, New Haven & Hartford railroad—an average of forty-six miles an hour.
