CLAY BEDS OF AMBOY.

Peculiar Deposits of Sediment Found

Millions of years ago certain sediments, which had their origin in the washing away of conglomerate rocks far to the northward, were brought by water and laid down over this part of New Jersey. From age to age the character of the material changed secording to the source from which it was fetched. First, says the Washington Star, the spade will turn up a red brick clay. This deposit will extend to a depth of three or four feet, perhaps. Beneath this will be a stratum or clay quite different in appearance, and speckled with iron. Underneath the latter is a layer technically termed "fire clay No. 1," and below this is "fire clay No. 2." Next comes a 'seamy" stratum, and finally a layer of what is called "extra sandy," which is at the bottom of the formation. All of these clays are useful, being applied to various purposes, according to character and quality. They go through processes of grinding and refining in the factories by which they are freed from impurities and made smooth and perfectly plastic.
