**THE WORLD'S CRIMINALS.**

In 1850 there were 6,737 persons in the prisons of this country, or 292 per 1,000,000 of population; now there are 29,238, or 1,480 per 1,000,000.

The prison population of India, large as it is, is only 38 per 100,000 inhabitants, or less than half the proportion that prevails in Great Britain.

In 1890 there were 45,333 penitentiary convicts in the United States, 19,378 inmates of the county jails and 14,846 boys and girls in the reformatories.

In Saxon murder cases the number of comparators demanded was sometimes very large. One case is recorded in which the judges demanded 1,000.

EXECUTIONS ceased to be public in England in 1865. Before that time they were in the squares in front of the jail and attracted thousands of people.

In 1887 163,359 persons were arrested in Great Britain for crime, of whom 82,251, or 50 per cent., were vagrants or persons having no stated employment.
