

Advices Received From Honolulu by the Steamer Australia.

QUEEN'S ADHERENTS ARE ARMING

The Provisional Government Is, However, Stronger Than Ever and Prepared to Resist All Attacks.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 16 .- A correspondent at Honolulu, writing under date of December 9, says: Since the 5th no material change has taken place in the military or political attitude of the different parties. The queen's adherents are being secretly armed. The marshal is satisfied that over 200 new Winchester rifles have been worked into Honolulu in small lots from the island of Mau during the past month and distributed. to the royalists. The police force under the marshal is now larger and in a higher state of organization than ever before. A vigilant watch is kept on the movements of the royalists. One hundred men on the citizens' reserve are selected who will reinforce the station house at a moment's call. The royalists express a certainty that on the arrival of the Alameda, the 22d, Minister Willis will carry out his orders to reinstate the queen. It is not believed that the royalists will make any independent or premature attack upon the strong position of the government.
