Rome, Dec. 22.-Mocenai, minister of war in the chamber of deputies, today announced the victory of the Italian troops over the Dervishes between Kassala Agordat in northeastern Africa. The Dervishes threatened to attack Agordat at night. The battle took place yesterday. The Dervishes numbered 10,000 and were completely routed, leaving several hundred dead. Sixty flags and a mitrailleuse were captured by the Italians. The mitrailleuse was made in England. The Italian loss was two officers killed and two wounded.
