Wasco county wants as few bankruptcies as possible, and desires to retain all those citizens who in ordinary times are able to pay their bills and help develop the country. It will do no real harm, then, to reduce the levy considerably less than formerly, and if it makes warrants a little longer in maturing, we can easily catch up with returning prosperity. While it is every officer's pride to make the best possible showing for himself during his administration, the true patriot will consider the condition of the people in times of adversity and lessen rather than increase their burden. In the name of the people of Wasco county, THE CHRONICLE urges the county court to do his share toward lessening their burdens this year in this manner.




