Aspirants for Mr. Hermann's place in the first district are trying to give out the impression that Mr. Hermann craves gubernatorial honors, which is far fetched. Mr. Hermann will serve his state better in the halls of congress than in the capacity of governor. It is bad policy now to attempt to "swap horses in the middle of the stream." The same thing applies to Mr. Ellis.

A report of the water commissioners is printed in another column, called forth from the following item in yesterday's CHRONICLE:

The question has been asked us, why do not the water commissioners submit a report once in a while, so that the public would know what becomes of the money collected. THE CHRONICLE believes that the qestion is pertinent, and suggests that the board make either a semi-annual or annual report.

We believe that if the commission had published a financial statement of the gross amounts collected and the disposition of such funds it would have been more satisfactory. It would have enlightened all, whereas it is a matter of great inconvenience for all those interested to ascertain these things for themselves. The Portland water commission publish their reports. Whether they are required to do so, or voluntarily, we do not know, but it is a source of considerable satisfaction to those who pay in this money, and it seems to us that when they are not published there is really nothing wrong in asking for them.

The democratic party is making a good deal more headway towards convincing the people that it is a mere aggregation of office-seekers than it is towards fulfilling its pledges and winning popular confidence. Since last August the country has learned that the democratic party is so infected with financial and economic heresies as to make it an object of apprehension to the conservative business interests of the nation. Nearly, if not quite, a majority of its representatives in congress are as unsound as the populists on the money questions and on questions of taxation. The elections of 1893 showed an unmistakable change of sentiment, and the fact that the Wilson bill excites more opposition than enthusiasm among democrats themselves is another sign of the turning tide. Why should the business world desire a change at this juncture? The present tariff is producing revenue by duties that are not felt. In order to carry out political engagements of the party in power this tariff must be cut down and a deficiency created to be made good by war taxes ten times as burdensome as the protective duties they replace.
