The willows which grow along the shores of the Mississippi river, says the Waverly Magazine, are of no use in the arts, but when it comes to building a dam the engineers find nothing that fills the bill half as well as the humble willow. It lines the shores and can be easily reached from the barges whereon it is transported, and it is so soft that it is easily cut and handled. It is woven into a great, long, continuous mat. One end of this is anchored to the shore on one side of the chute that is to be dammed, and the process of weaving is thence carried on straight across the stretch of water on a peculiarly-shaped boat called a grasshop-per. As fast as the mat is woven on the grasshopper it slides into the water at the lower end of the inclined weaving rack, and it is laden with rocks and carried straight to the bottom, and this is continued until the opposite shore is reached. The mat is then covered to the proper depth, twelve to fifteen inches, with rock, and then anwoven and laid down on top of the first and similarly weighted down, and this work is continued till the dam has risen as high as it is intended to stand the finishing, being always a heavy coating of rock that covers the willow and all. The willow, always covered with water and the mud that inevitably lodges among the rocks of the dam,



TOBONTO, Feb. 21 .- A canal scheme to connect Georgian bay with Lake Ontario the reet. has passed the committee stages. It is now to go to the council for ratification. If successful the promoters promise to spend \$65,000,000 on it. Traffic going by way of the Erie canal will be diverted to Lake Ontario and through the St. Lawrence river to Europe. The route is 839 miles shorter than by the Lake Erie canal. The promoters expect to get all the Western traffic.
