Opinions of Various Governors on the onel Wyant, under guard of a full com-Corbett-Jackson Fght. SPRINGFIELD, Massry March 5 .- The editor of the Springfield Union asked the governors of all the states whether the laws of their states permit prizefighting, and whether they would allow the Corbett-Jackson fight. The Union this afternoon publishes replies of 37 governors, representing the states of Alabama, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio. Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Washington and West Virginia, All say the law prohibits prize fights, and they would not permit the Corbett-Jackson fight in their respective states, except the following: Governor Waite, of Colorado, says:


Bishop Paddock Dead.

The only really important thing that Mr. Bland has succeeded in doing is in putting the democrats of the house, with their 90 majority, in a very deep hole, and in leaving a chasm between the silver and anti-silver democrats that is not likely to be bridged during the present session of Congress, and which will be almost certain to make trouble among the democrate when the tariff bill comes back from the senate, if it ever does.
