GAVE THEM GOLD MINES.

Australia's Method of Caring for Her Unemployed.

An Experiment That Proved to Be a Great Success in Providing for Poor People Who Were Entirely Destitute.

An odd means of helping the unemployed was devised by the government of Victoria during last winter, when trade was duller and distress more acute and general than in very many years past.

Twenty to fifty and a hundred families were located in some of the diggings. Most of the districts selected for these settlements were along streams and here was generally found land suitable for raising fruits and vegetables.

The government also settled about eighteen hundred men, most of them with families, on government land, under the provisions of an act recently passed for the formation of village settlements and homestead associations and communities.
