A RIDE ON A WHALE.

The Stirring and Versclous Yarn of a Mas Capt. Jim Willis, who hails from Morehead City, N. C., where he runs pleasure craft for the accommodation of northern consumptives, had an experience with a whale that came near making a Jonah of him. In his own story, as given to a Washington Star reporter, he says: "One sunny afternoon, not very long ago, I was sitting in the shade of my own fig tree and swinging in my own grapevine swing. A party of my fisher friends who lived farther up the beach, came running by,

'There she blows!' This cry woke me up. I saw a jet of water spurted upward from the sea, and down to the pier I rushed. There wasn't a real whaleboat in the town, but four ordinary fishing boats were manned by as many crews. One carried the harpoon gun and one the hand-hurling apparatus. The other two were without any armament excepting several shotguns and one or two rifles. We rowed off so as to come at the game from different points of the compass. I was in the gunboat. As we approached the whale it was seen that he was a large and fat one. He took no notice of our coming. When we got within about one hundred feet of the monster the harpoon gun was fired, and the barbed weapon took effect just behind the head and pretty well up on the back. 
