Count of Paris Very Weak.


LONDON, Aug. 31 .- A dispatch from Stowe House this morning says the Count of Paris is very weak, but his general condition is no worse than yestesday.



CITY OF MEXICO, Aug. 31.-A grand reception and ball was given by United Minister Isaac P. Gray last night. The legation was illuminated by electricity, and was profusely and beautifully decorated. Four hundred guests were present, among them President Diaz, Mrs. and Miss Diaz, members of the cabinet. and diplomatic representatives and congressmen, bankers, governors of states and members of the bar. Fifty honored guests sat at the official table, which was presided over by the American minister. The principal toast was proposed


